filmmakers also stress the need for governments to work more on recycle programmes, and look at how technology is developing that can convert plastic	w.f.

We make a staggering number of plastic. In terms of plastic bags alone, we use	w.w.
five hundred billion worldwide annually. Over 300 millions tons of plastic are	w.f.
produced every year, and at least 8 million of those are dumped at the oceans.	w.w.
