Do you remember when we compare in life?

- When we want to **buy something**
This t-shirt is cheaper than this other one.
- When we want to **eat something**
Cake is more delicious than fries.
- When we want to **go somewhere**
Viña del Mar is more beautiful than Curicó
- etc.

COMPARISON OF (long)ADJECTIVES

- We use more and most with two-syllable adjectives not ending in -y, and with longer ones.
 - careful
 - boring
 - famous
 - exciting
 - reliable
 - more careful
 - more boring
 - more famous
 - more exciting
 - more reliable

We also have some exceptions...

Adjective	Comparative
good	better
bad	worse
far (distance)	farther
far (time)	further
late (time)	latter / latter than
little (time)	less than

Example: Rangers is better than Universidad Católica 😊

~~Rangers is gooder than Universidad Católica ☹️~~



