Present Simple

Affirmative	Negative	
	Long form	Short Form
I walk	I do not walk	I don't walk
You walk	You do not walk	You don't walk
He walks	He does not walk	He doesn't walk
She walks	She does not walk	She doesn't walk
It walks	It does not walk	It doesn't walk
We walk	We do not walk	We don't walk
You walk	You do not walk	You don't walk
They walk	They do not walk	They don't walk

We use the **present simple** for repeated actions or permanent situations.

Spelling of 3rd person singular for verbs ending in:

ss, sh, ch, x, o + es	consonant + y → ies	vowel + y + s
I brush - he brushes	I cry - he cries	I play - he plays
