**CONDITION**                      **RESULT**

**PRESENT SIMPLE**      +      **FUTURE SIMPLE**

✔ If I go to Italy next week for work, I'll visit the Colosseum.

✔ If I have time tomorrow, I will help you.

✔ If you touch that wire, you will get an electric shock.

WE USE FIRST CONDITIONAL WHEN WE ARE TALKING ABOUT *POSSIBLE PLANS*, *PROMISES*, *WARNINGS*, *THREATS* OR FOR *PERSUADING* SOMEONE.
